





Start of work to deconstruct the original Champlain Bridge










Mobility: A Key Part of Our Mission



- + 10-year work planning horizon:
 - Optimize work sites and minimize impact on mobility
 - JCCBI: an active member of Mobility Montréal
- Proactive communication with road users and active mobility users: various tools
- Winter operations on the Jacques Cartier Bridge multipurpose path and sidewalk
- + Project to reconstruct the Bonaventure Expy.:
 - Maintain road capacity in the SDC Bridge / Port of Montreal corridor
 - Add a 3.5-km active mobility corridor and provide access to the river





Innovate and Advance Knowledge



- + Study of the seismic performance of the Jacques Cartier Bridge
- Deconstruction of the Champlain Bridge:
 - 10 research projects started
 - Material Reuse Competition

+ Knowledge-sharing with the industry: our experts participated in 11 technical events





Connected to the Community



- JCCBI's participatory approach
 - Meetings with residents and users
 - Institutional Partners Committee (Bonaventure Expy. reconstruction project)
 - Advisory Committee (Champlain Bridge deconstruction)
- Over \$25,000 in donations and sponsorships

 - Special donation of \$5,000 to Centraide of Greater Montreal (pandemic)






Jacques Cartier Bridge: \$71.6M



Main work

- Continuation of the steel repair and paintsystem replacement program on part of the superstructure
- + Completion of work to repair the pedestals (Montreal) and concrete abutment (Longueuil)
- + Paving repairs on the bridge deck
- + Start of work to manage drainage water and to redevelop the land in the Montreal sector
- Start of construction of the new building for the O&M team







Deconstruction of the Original Champlain Bridge: \$78.5M =

Main work carried out during the financial year

- + Deconstruction of the abutment, two spans and one pier on IDS
- + Construction of 2 jetties on IDS and in Brossard
- Deconstruction of 7 spans from the IDS jetty
- + Mobilization of equipment to deconstruct the marine spans

Deconstruction duration: 43 months (scheduled end date: January 2024)






5 Components of the Deconstruction



- Deconstruction of the original bridge
- Environmental protection: Protect the St.
 Lawrence River and biodiversity and minimize the impact on the community
- 3. Repurpose 287,000 tons of material (concrete, steel, asphalt): prioritize reuse and recycling and provide traceability
- 4. 10 R&D projects: Help advance knowledge (performance and infrastructure sustainability)
- 5. Héritage Champlain: Redevelop land along the shoreline freed up by the deconstruction
 - Provide access to the river
 - Commemorate the original bridge





Bonaventure Sector: \$14.8M



Main work

- + Various repairs to the structures of the elevated sections
- Major repairs to non-elevated lanes work to maintain the safety of this section (which is at the end of its service life) until it can be replaced

Solution Bonaventure - \$2.6M

 Help protect the St. Lawrence River by operating the groundwater containment and treatment system (West sector) and hydrocarbon capture system (East sector)






Honoré Mercier Bridge: \$21M


Main work

- + Pier repairs
- Replacement of the paint system on part of the steel structure
- Replacement of a section of the gangways used for inspection work
- + Continuation of prefeasibility study of:
 - road surface at the bridge's approaches
 - connection of the multi-purpose path to the municipal network
 - creation of a memorial pathway
- Launch of a prefeasibility study to increase the service level of the multipurpose path



Melocheville Tunnel and Estacade: \$3.4M






Melocheville Tunnel

- + No major work
- General inspection of the structure, equipment and approaches

- + No major work
- Detailed inspection of all structural elements




Government

Highlights



- + Highlights from 2020-2021 include the start of deconstruction of the original Champlain Bridge as well as additional work on all structures, which resulted in:
 - Growth of \$32M in financial assets to meet additional commitments
 - + Growth of \$39M in liabilities related to the payment milestones for the deconstruction project
 - + A \$42M increase in non-financial assets
 - A \$51M increase in expenses, mainly for the deconstruction project
- + Revenues were impacted by the decrease in interest rates
